By the time of the 1932 election, unemployment in the U. S. had reached 13,000,000. National wages were 60% less than in 1929 and dividends were 56.6% less. U. S. business was operating at one-half of 1929 volume and total business loss for the year was placed at \$5-6 billion. The nation decided it was time for a change. Here are the results of the election.

- 1) **Herbert Hoover won the states of Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, and Vermont. Lightly shade those states.**
- 2) **Franklin D. Roosevelt won the remainder of the states. Leave those states white.**

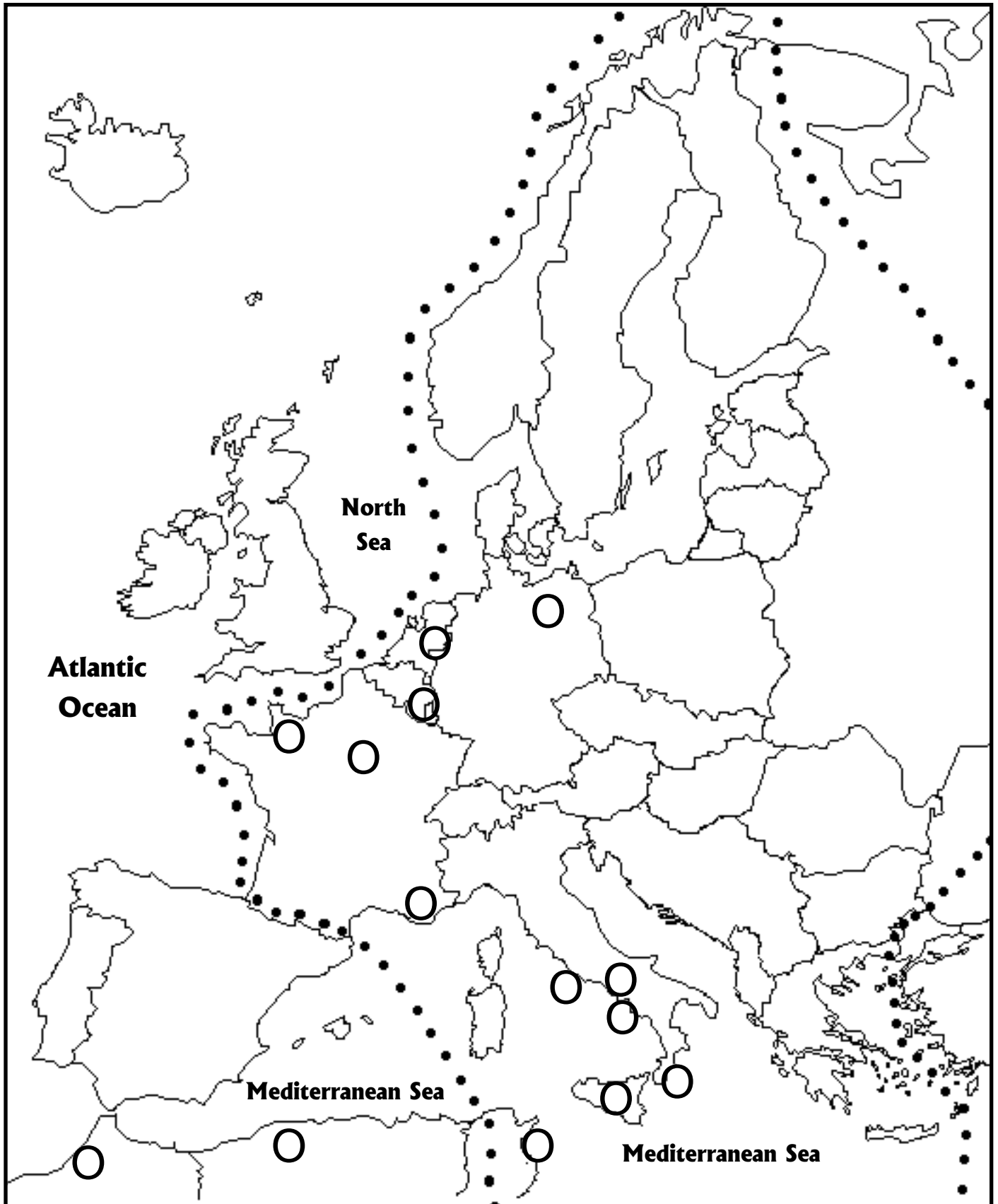
