

The activities in this unit cover the period of America's History from 1975-2003. Each activity can be used independently so you may choose those that fit your lesson plans and time schedule.

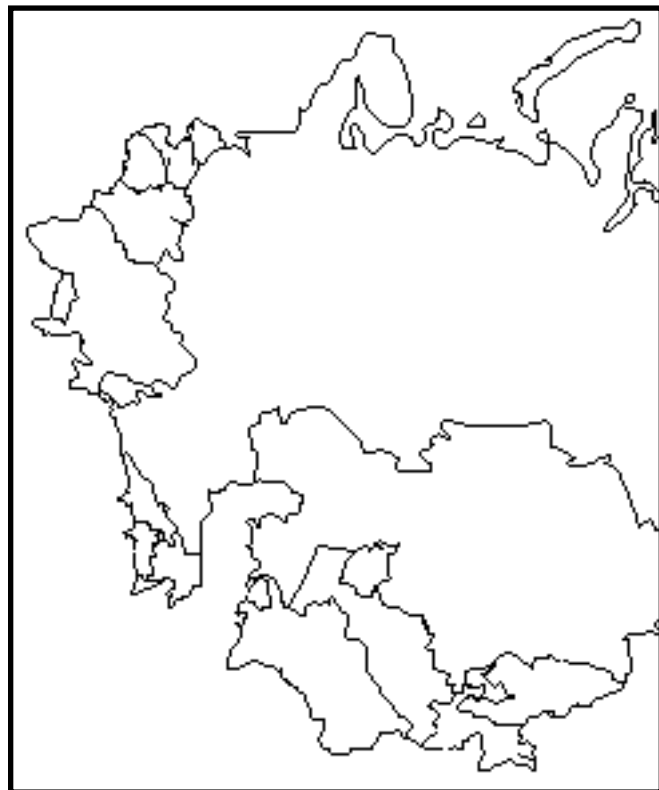

The maps of Europe and the old Soviet Union were redrawn as new nations were created.

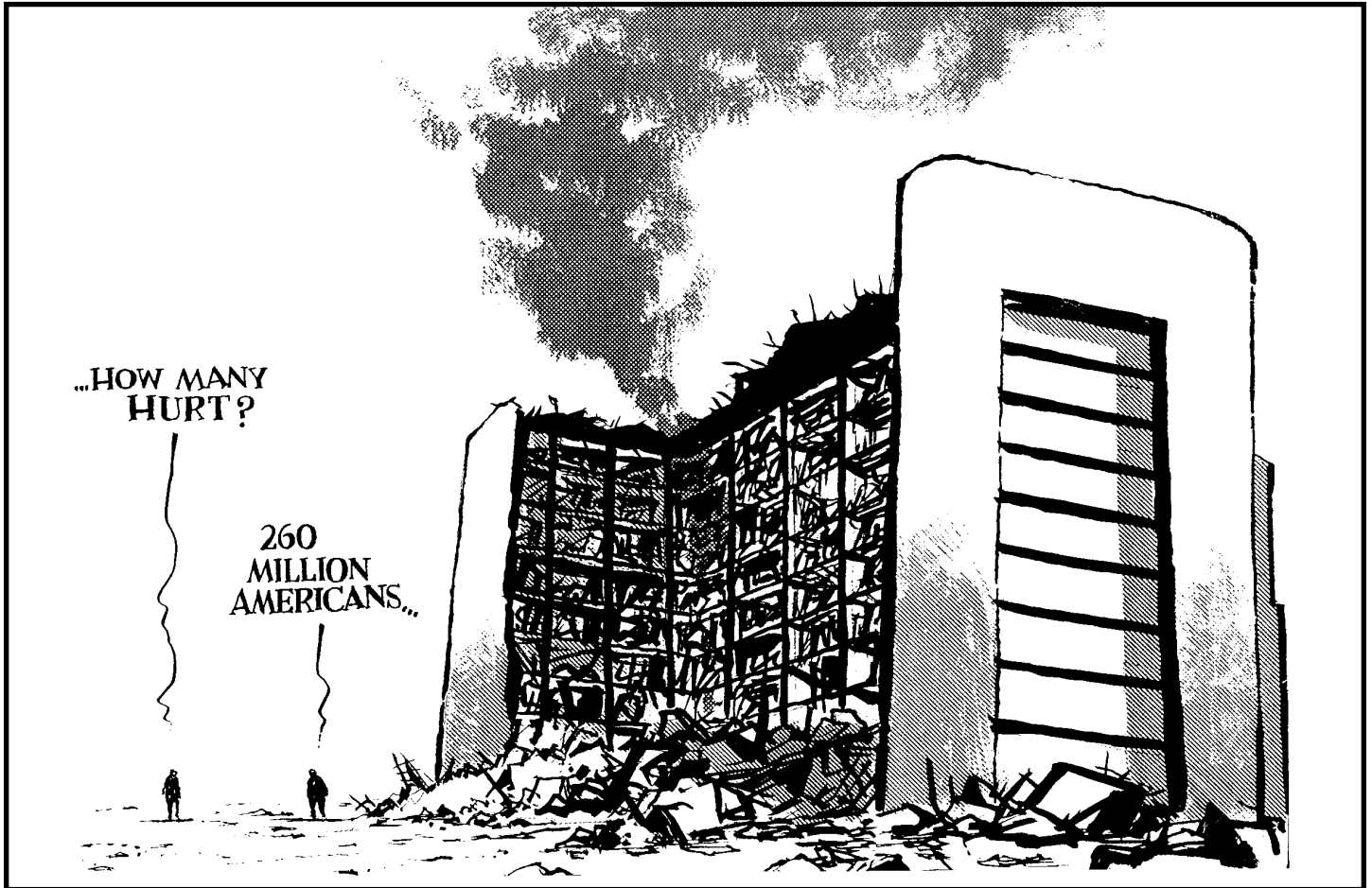

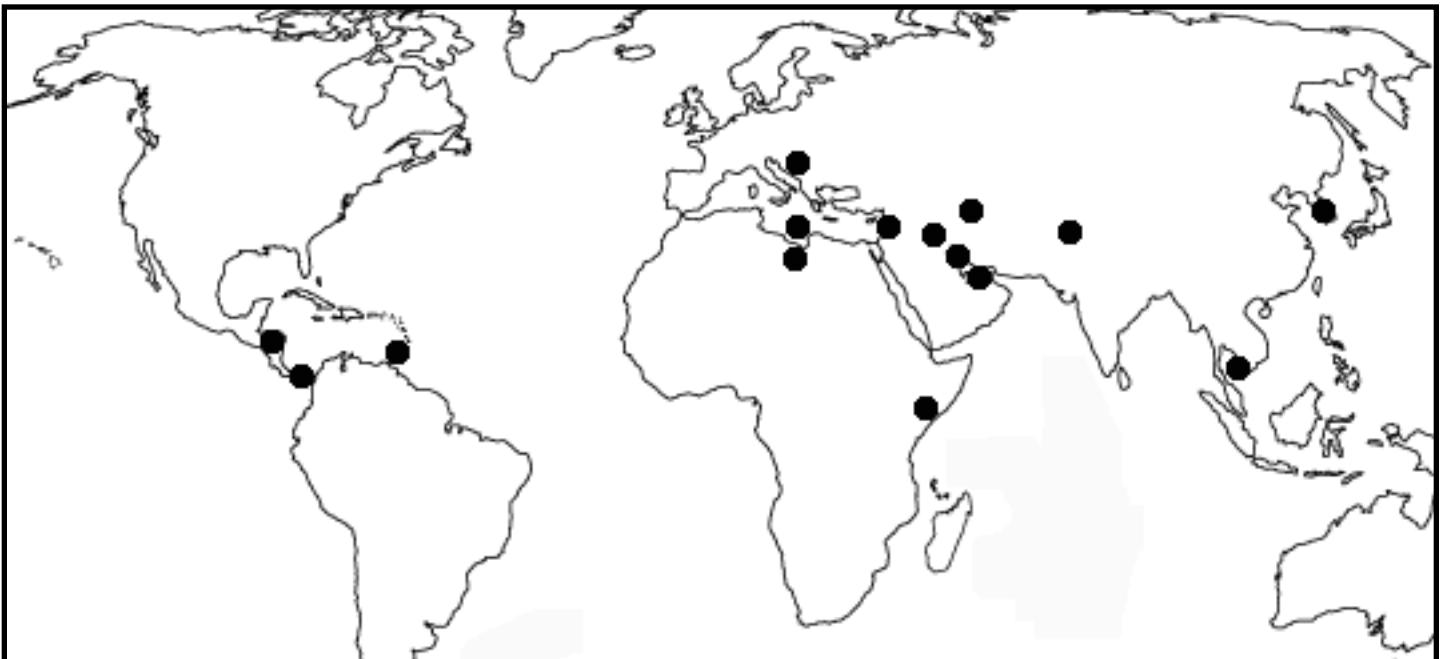

Number each circle on the map. Some circles will be used more than once.

1. (1975) U. S. ship *Mayaguez* seized by Cambodian forces in Cambodian territorial waters. Rescued on May 14.
2. (1979) Two U. S. soldiers were killed by North Korean troops in the demilitarized zone.
3. (1979) The U. S. embassy in Teheran was seized. 65 American hostages were taken.
4. (1979) The U. S. embassy in Islamabad, Pakistan was besieged. One U. S. marine was killed.
5. (1980) A U. S. hostage rescue mission ended in failure. 8 U. S. troops were killed and 5 wounded.
6. (1981) Two Libyan jets were shot down by navy fighters after being attacked off the Libyan coast.
7. (1982) 800 marines landed in Beirut, Lebanon to help oversee withdrawal of PLO fighters from the city.
8. (1983) U. S. marine headquarters in Beirut was destroyed. 241 marine and navy personnel were killed.
9. (1983) The invasion of Grenada. U. S. casualties were 18 dead and 115 wounded.
10. (1983) U. S. warplanes attacked Syrian positions near Beirut. One pilot was killed and one wounded.
11. (1986) Missile exchange with Libyan forces in the Gulf of Sidra.
12. (1986) U. S. air strike against Libya.
13. (1987) An Iraqi missile attack on the U. S. frigate *Stark* in the northern Persian Gulf. 37 sailors were killed.
14. (1988) 3,200 troops were sent to Honduras based on reports of Nicaraguan incursions into the country.
15. (1988) Naval attack on Iranian forces in the southern half of the Persian Gulf.
16. (1988) A U. S. navy warship shot down an Iranian passenger jet at the southern end of the Persian Gulf.
17. (1989) The U.S. invades Panama in an attempt to capture General Manuel Noriega.
18. (1991) U. S. and allied troops defeat Iraq following Iraq's invasion of Kuwait.
19. (1993) U.S. and U.N. forces attack somalian rebel factions and administer humanitarian aid.
20. (1995) Bosnia. NATO, U.S., and U.N. forces attempt to secure a cease-fire in an ethnic war.
